Matters as to submission of Govt reports on  
Mr. Allen staff of R.R.R.

In connection with the post of Chief Engineer, Nigeria Railway, Mr. Hunter and I found ourselves unable to put up any possible candidates from the Kenya - Uganda Railway, as it would appear that since 1925 (i.e., I presume, since the creation of the post of High Commissioner for Transport) no annual reports have been rendered by these officers. I think it would be desirable to call the attention of the High Commissioner for Transport to the fact, and point out that unless the officers on the Kenya - Uganda Railway are to be debarred from consideration for employment elsewhere, which would be objectionable both in their own interests and those of the Empire as a whole, it is desirable that we should be furnished with annual reports. Perhaps the Department, who know a great deal more than I do about the establishment of the Line, would suggest the limit below which the reports need not be rendered. (There might, possibly, be two limits, one of a minimum service, the other of a minimum pay.)

I have the honour to inform

you that prior to the establishment of

the Transport Administration, Confidential

DRAFT copy of minutes

reports on officers of the Kenya-Uganda

Railway were furnished by the Governor

of Kenya at the same time as the reports

on officers in the services of the

Colonial Government.

2. No confidential reports have  
been received from you since the Transport

Administration was set up; and you will

readily appreciate that in the absence of

such reports officers in that Administra-

tion are likely to be at a disadvantage

when opportunities for promotion on

transfer occur and their claims to such

promotion have to be compared with

those of officers in other Colonies.

3. I should therefore be glad if you  
in future would furnish me with annual reports.

It is necessary for the purpose of record in  
the Colonial Office that these reports should be  
sent in duplicates, but I should of course  
have no objection to any arrangement for  
diminishing the labour involved, such for  
example as that suggested in my Confidential (2)

despatch to the Governor of Kenya of the

20th August 1920, a copy of which is enclosed.

4. As regards the cases of officers on  
whom Confl. reports should be rendered annually,

I shall be satisfied if such reports are limited  
furnished in respect of  
to officers with not less than five years service,  
who are drawing not less than £720 a year or on a scale of  
salary the maximum of which is not less than £720.

be in some detail, and in this connection I enclose
