Kenya Ordinances and Bills.

The position is as follows:-

ORDINANCES: Two authenticated copies are received,
followed later by twelve printed copies. The
number is sufficient to meet normal demands.
Further copies are ordered if at any time the stock
of any particular Ordinance is exhausted (or nearly
so, in the case of an important Ordinance).

The delay in receiving the twelve printed
copies often causes great inconvenience to all concerned.
If printed copies could be received at the same time
as the authenticated copies, or failing that, by the
following mail, it would be a great help. Only one
authenticated Ordinance of 1928 has been received to
date viz No 4 of 1928. The plain copies have yet to
arrive at the library.

BILLS.

BILLS: All Bills are published in the Gazette, of which six copies are received.

Recently however, separate printed copies of the undermentioned Bills have been received in the Library in addition to the publication in the Gazette:-

- Native Lands Trust - 7 copies
- Native Authority (Am) - 11
- Land and Agricultural Bank - 2 copies
- Native Lands Trust - 26 copies

The last mentioned Bill was recently in demand - see minute above. At the time the supply of Gazettes containing the Bill was evidently exhausted. Printed copies were, and still are, available.

It is very desirable that printed copies of all the more important Bills should be supplied independently of the Gazette copies.

With reference to your despatch No.588 of the 14th August, 1928, I have the honour to inform you that no session of the Legislative Council was held during the first four months of 1928 and that the first Ordinance passed in 1928 did not receive assent until the 26th June.

As experience has shown that plain printed copies of Ordinances cannot be made ready until some time after assent has been given, I am making arrangements whereby twelve additional copies of each Ordinance, in the form in which it is prepared for assent, after having been passed in the Legislative Council, will be printed and forwarded to you with the authenticated copy of the Ordinance, and I trust that this step will help to surmount the difficulties mentioned in paragraph 2. of your despatch.

Sir,
 I have the honour to inform you that the recent practice of sending to me printed copies of certain Bills introduced in the Legislative Council has proved a great convenience, and I should much appreciate the continued supply of such documents in the case of all important measures. Six copies should normally suffice unless the Bill is one of exceptional importance, when a larger supply would be desirable. If this course is followed, I do not think it will be necessary to ask you to augment the supply of Kenya Official

Gazettes, although, in the absence of separate prints of Bills, the present supply ^{has} frequently proved inadequate.

(1) I take this opportunity of ~~mentioning~~ ^{advising} that it recently became necessary to deposit in the Library of the House of Commons, one of the two authenticated copies of an Ordinance which had formed the subject of a question in the House, ~~because no unauthenticated~~ ^{no plain} copies ^{having} had been received. This is indeed the position in respect of the whole of the legislation of 1928, and I should be glad if you would be good enough to take steps to ensure that the ordinary prints of Ordinances are forwarded with, or ^{immediately} ~~at the~~ ^{at the} earliest possible date after, those ^{copies} which are specially authenticated by you.
