With reference to your letter of the 28th June, No.15550/D/29, regarding the position of officers and men in receipt of disability or wounds pensions who serve in the Kenya Defence Force, I am commanded by My Lords Commissioners of the Admiralty to acquaint you, for the information of the Secretary of State for the Colonies, that the question of the position of officers and men in receipt of disability pensions arising out of service during the great war is a matter for the Ministry of Pensions, by which Department such pensions are paid.
