I have the honour to refer to my despatch Transport No. 143 dated 15th October 1927, regarding the appointment of Mr H.F. Hawes to the post of "Legal Adviser, Railway and Harbours Administration".

2. The period of Mr Hawes' probation expired on the 30th ultimo and as during these two years probationary service his work has given every satisfaction I recommend for Your Lordship's approval that Mr Hawes should now be confirmed in his position.

3. From the experience of the last few years I am of the opinion that the post of Legal Adviser, Railways and Harbours Administration, will be permanently required and that it is one which should be pensionable. I accordingly recommend for Your Lordship's sanction that this post be added to the list of pensionable posts approved in Mr Amery's despatch No. 14 of 15th February 1928. Further, in the event of Your Lordship's approval to the above proposals, I recommend that Mr Hawes be admitted to pensionable rights with effect from 1st October 1927.

Sir,

It has been represented to me that the post of Motor Transport Officer should be included in the list of Pensionable Posts. This post was created in 1925 and received final sanction in your despatch No.42 of the 15th Nov. 1924 F/26 of June 1926.

2. Mr W.S. Godfrey, Engineer in the Marine Department, was appointed to the post in April 1925, and in the ordinary course of promotion would have become eligible for pension on reaching the position of Chief Engineer. This latter post carries with it emoluments corresponding to those of the Motor Transport Officer's Grade, £600 to £40 to £720.

3. While I was not inclined to recommend that the post should be made pensionable on these grounds, the General Manager has called my attention to the necessity for ensuring continuity of tenure in the post of Motor Transport Officer, and I am advised by him that the position is one to which pensionable status should be accorded.

4. I have the honour in consequence to enquire whether you would be prepared to give your sanction to this post being made pensionable.
