 - (c) That a Lake Fishery inthority whose duties would include research into the pessibilities of further administration and the carrying out of the recommendations should be established

3. IN EXERCISE of my powers under section 28 of the above mentioned Ordinance, I hereby prohibit fishing with any net the mesh of which is less than five inches unless the thread of which it is composed is as thick as or thicker than the flax twine known as No.30/3 ply and no net shall be used in which the thread of the meshes is composed of separate strands liable to some apart during use.

This Proclamation shall come into force on the let day of January, 1930.

PROCLAMATION MADE UNDER THE GAME ORDINANCE.

IN EXERCISE of my powers under section 28 of the above mentioned Ordinance, I hereby prohibit fishing with any net the mesh of which is less than five inches unless the thread of which it is composed is as thick as or thicker than the flax twine known as No.30/3 ply and no net shall be used in which the thread of the meshes is composed of separate strands light to some apart during use.

This Proclamation shall come into force on the let day of Januar, 1930.
