Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of the 20th March No. 8443/25 transmitting a despatch from the late Governor of Kenya in which it is suggested that we should take the place of Messrs. Rendel, Palmer & Tritton as Consulting Engineers to the Uganda Railway.

2. We enclose a copy of a letter from Messrs. Rendel Palmer & Tritton, in which they ask to be relieved of the duties of Consulting Engineers for the open line of the Uganda Railway but suggest that they would like to continue as Consulting Engineers on new construction works in the Colony and also for Marine Department work.

3. We think this arrangement should meet the wishes of the Government and the General Manager. It would be difficult for us to take over the consulting work of advising on the new Construction in the Colony.

as Messrs. Rendel Palmer & Tritton have had charge of this work from its inception, but there would be no difficulty in our taking over the work for the Open Lines.

4. We suggest therefore for the consideration of the Secretary of State that we should take over the Consulting work for Open Lines and the Inspection work both for Open Lines and for any material required for construction. Our reason for this last suggestion being that it is very difficult on instant work to differentiate between Open Lines and New Construction. If, for instance, the Railway orders ten locomotives it is impossible to say how many of these will be used on construction and how many on open lines. We therefore suggest that all Inspection work should be in our hands with the exception of the work for the Marine Department of the Railway.

5. The Marine Department work of the Railway, both Consulting and Inspection, has always been done by Messrs. Rendel Palmer & Tritton and we believe the Colonial Government have been satisfied with this work and we suggest therefore that this work should be left with them.

6. In the second paragraph of the late Governor's letter of the 14th January which formed the enclosure to your letter under reply, he asks for information as to what our charges will be.

(a) As regards Inspection work I enclose a table of fees charged for this work which have duly been sanctioned by the Secretary of State.

(b) As regards Consulting work, namely Surveying and advisory, the fees sanctioned by the Secretary of State in

a letter of the 7th December, 1912 are as follows: The  
actual cost of draughtsmen's time plus a percentage  
varying on a sliding scale with the value of the work  
as below:-

1% on orders not exceeding £5,000.

1½% on orders exceeding £5,000 but not exceeding  
£10,000 with a minimum fee of £50.

2% on orders exceeding £10,000 with a minimum fee  
of £75.

Where complete drawings and specifications are prepared  
but no contracts placed, half the above percentages are  
charged.
