WIDOWS' AND ORPHANS' PENSION SCHEME.

Request instructions as to payment of arrears of contributions by Mr J. E. M. Head and Mr W. R. Elliott, who were permitted to remain outside the scheme owing to the misapprehension, in Kenya, that their posts were pensionable.

MINUTES

Sir,

I have the honour to enclose, for the consideration of the Secretary of State, extracts from a letter from the Treasurer, Kenya, regarding the failure to recover contributions to the East African Widows' and Orphans' Pension Scheme from Messrs. J.B. Noad and W.R. Elliott, who were appointed to the Kenya Service in 1923.

1. I would observe that the actual Agreement signed by Mr. Elliott, equally with that entered into by Mr. Noad, provided for contributions to be made, and there is therefore no difference between the two cases in this respect. It may, however, be that my clerical error, the copy sent to the Colonial Government was incorrect in this respect.

2. It is clear that under their Agreements both these men were compulsory contributors to the Scheme and in both cases the Treasurer was notified by us in the usual way of the addition of their names to the Register of Contributors to the Scheme, in 1923. No question was raised by him on the subject, nor were we advised that in his opinion it could not be carried out.

3. There seems to us to be no case for the deduction from contribution of either of these men, and we are of the opinion that they are both liable from the dates of their embarkation.

5. The fact that Mr. Bond has since been transferred to the Uganda Railways Service makes a consideration of difference, as he would then have been given an option to discontinue his contributions. If he had died before his transfer, however, payment of the pension to his widow, which was and is registered in our books, would not have been affected by the Government's omission to recover his contributions.

6. I have to request the Secretary of State's instructions as to whether either or both of these men should be called upon to pay the arrears of contributions due from them, and if so, whether Mr. Bond should be given the option to discontinue from the date of his transfer up to and including the last payment.

Woods' & Orphans' Pension Scheme.

Ross J. E. M. (D.S.F. 6126). Mr. Ross was appointed as an Assistant Engineer in January 1926 and he elected not to contribute to the scheme. As the post was a pensionable one it was assumed that he had this option but it now transpires that Mr. Ross was in an agreement and he should therefore have contributed as from the last day which his engagement took effect. Mr. Ross has been transferred to the Railways Department and is now contributing to the scheme. In the circumstances I suggest that you do the same except as from the last day of his original election not to contribute.

Yours faithfully S. G. (D.S.F. 6461) This wage is similar to that of Mr. Ross except that no agreement signed or paid off him to the date of his transfer to the Woods' & Orphans' Pension Scheme.

In view of the fact that the above wage is similar to the one of Mr. Ross and that he did not contribute to the scheme I suggest that you do the same except as from the last day of his original election not to contribute.
