Cold Storage Department of the British Government during the war. It might mention here that we have a number of English and Australian shareholders.

The Agricultural Department here, I believe, that there are about 5,000,000 native cattle in Tanganyika Territory not served by any such works. We are of the opinion that their quality would be quite suitable for the manufacture of canned meats.

In the earlier part of the war, of course, a great deal of the best of these cattle were exported, but now it is considerably in the reverse of the Territory under consideration.

Could you give us any information regarding Tanganyika Territory and suitable water power or what resources it has as to operating our works? Our estimate would be from 5 to 10,000,000 of water, and could handle an estimated amount of 100,000,000 lbs. of meat.

Is it not possible to get the cattle to the side of the river? I believe you would find a great amount of water power available in the river and its tributaries for information give these things.

We must mention, of course, that operation would be subject to the license, there is no doubt, but in the event of any part would be emptied into the beds of rivers in which the fish would be caught. In this way, any pollution of the waters would be avoided.

The main point we wish to stress is, of course, that we want to operate at a distance from existing land works so that the cattle may be purchased on as reasonable a basis as possible.


