The Potassium Effect
The effect of potassium on the rate of photosynthesis has been studied by many workers. The results are not uniform, however, and it is difficult to draw any general conclusions. Some workers have found that potassium increases the rate of photosynthesis, while others have found that it has no effect or even inhibits it. The effect of potassium on photosynthesis may depend on various factors such as the concentration of potassium, the type of plant, the light intensity, the temperature, and the presence of other ions.


