As regards Uganda, Mr. Hutcheon's retirement took effect last month, but we have not had anything from the O.A.C. regarding the question of a successor. As a matter of fact, we have not asked for anything, pending confirmation of Mr. Montgomery's representations as to his status.

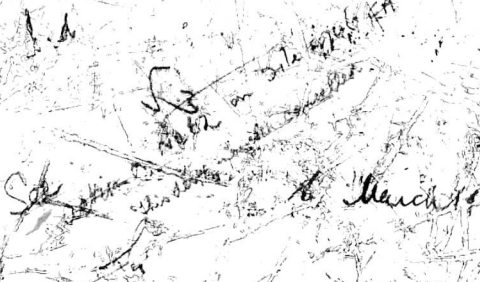
