The Italian Section is to consist of 3

May 1st, and the Italian proposal means that cession will ~~not~~ take place on June 1st if we agree.

The local Govt. did not suggest actually a month, but only the "fuller" possible notice. On the other hand, the notice they will get will be rather less than 3 weeks, under the Italian proposal, and this seems hardly enough to meet their request. The delay is not our fault, and perhaps (assuming that we can get a tel. off today) it would be enough to agree to the date June 11th (or if our tel. is not sent off today, one month from the date of sending). We could at the same time send our letter to the F.O. telling them that SGS has agreed to this date & that OAG has been instructed accordingly.



NOTE VERBALE.

The Royal Ministry for Foreign Affairs have the honour to acknowledge receipt of Note Verbaile No. 137 of the 17th April, in which His Britannic Majesty's Embassy informed them that the British Government consented to the transfer of the Jubaland territory taking place without awaiting settlement of the questions arising from Articles 9 and 10 of the Convention, provided that previous notice of at least one month of the date of cession were given to the Governor of Kenya.

In taking note of the above and in begging His Britannic Majesty's Embassy to be so good as to convey to their Government the thanks of the Royal Government for the favourable disposition displayed, the Royal Ministry for Foreign Affairs have the honour to observe that in such circumstances it will be desirable to fix the date of the cession at once, having also in mind that the exchange of the ratifications of the Convention of the 1st July 1914 must not soon take place. Vimely instructions to the Consul-General by His Britannic Majesty's Government can thus be given to the Italian High Commissioner for Jubaland.

In begging His Britannic Majesty to be so good as to report to the Royal Government on the matter and to acquaint them with their intentions the Royal Ministry for Foreign Affairs state that the

Italian section of the Mixed Commission for the delimitation of the boundaries is composed of Lieut.-Colonel of the Engineers Cav. Giovanni Dotto, Major Tedesco-Zimmerman, Colonial Counsellor Cav. Antonio Scarpa, besides two or three operators.

Furthermore as regards the fresh formula proposed by the British Government for the frontier between Italian and English territories (in explanation of the expression "boundary between the provinces of Tassilano and Jubaland"); the Royal Ministry for Foreign Affairs consider that it can be accepted with one single addition.

It appears in fact to the Royal Ministry for Foreign Affairs that the formula in question does not sufficiently identify the point where the south-westerly line, departing from the junction of the meridians in position with the parallel of latitude south of 5° S should terminate. This point, however, was definitely indicated in the formula proposed by the Royal Ministry for Foreign Affairs in their Note Verbale No. 8168 of April 20th last.

Moreover the course of the initial formula ("to a point due north of the first on the coast") could thus be modified... "by to a point situated south six kilometres north of the point on the coast".




