Your telegram No. 124 (of June 27th) (enclosed),  
concerning misinterpretation of our note to have  
been sent to assist in your note to Italian  
Government enclosed in your despatch No. 124 (of  
27th).

Your telegram No. 125 (of 27th) stated that  
movable property was to pass to Italian Government  
on date of transfer while immovable property was to  
remain British until later date. With reference  
to your note Italian Government is of the  
view that movable property including river transport  
is to pass to them on date of transfer and agree to  
immovable property being transferred later after  
a treaty.

It is stressed that they cannot  
agree to proceed unless they can keep river transport  
until withdrawal of British garrison is complete.  
These exact conditions at once to Italian Government  
and to see that to alter their reply to conform with  
official office wishes.
