I think we'd better, in this morning, let Mr. A. G. Acker call  
Lyall, or his adjt, & suggest to him that he should  
present the following to the Governor & the Sudan, that we  
are prepared to negotiate - F.A. after conference -  
they must be engaged with us & in view of the position  
notwithstanding the fact that we are to the north & they to the south, it would be  
an important consideration at the end of the conference. It has  
not been decided what it is to other Administrations.

As far as you saw to Lyall this morning &  
expressed the present situation. M. Lyall said that

he was assuming that the party would not  
be before the middle of January, necessarily  
arriving to leave England on Dec. 4 for  
Khartoum, where he would consult with his Agents  
before leaving for Nairobi (via Uganda). All he  
asked for was that he should leave the agenda  
as soon as fixed, and should be told the date of  
the Conference -

G. Gore's letter to the Colonial Governors offering his provisional signature on the grounds of the Conference.


