I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Strachey's letter of the 11th instant (25519/25) relative to the appointment of the British personnel of the Boundary Commission set up under the Anglo Italian treaty of July 15th 1924, for the cession of territory in East Africa to the Italian Government.

Answers

Kerdolite

The Kerdolite asked for shall be supplied from the

Technical Stores

It is assumed that the technical stores required by
such (as are not available from Kerdolite) will
be 600 N. & stores now to be afforded can be supplied
by your department. In the case of Sergeant G.W.R. Bates RE,
who accompanied Lt. Col. King, the arrangements for the supply of
rifles, and camp equipment was made by that Opie and referred
to the Opie in a letter of 17th April 1925, a copy of which is enclosed.
It is not clear whether camp equipment for the remaining personnel
is intended to be despatched separately in addition to technical
stores, and I am to expect that in those (about 600 rifles)
shall also communicate direct with the Opie at first point, when
any necessary arrangements can be made for him to supply those
rifles to my men be forwarded from their stocks.

SIR,

I have etc., to refer to my telegram of
the 17th of April, in which I asked to be furnished
as soon as possible with an estimate of the cost of
the local staff to be employed in connection with
the delimitation of the territory ceded to the
Italian Government under the Treaty of July 15th,
1924.

2. The Memorandum of proposals for the work
of the Joint Commission which accompanied my
despatch No. 323 of 2nd April contemplated a
preliminary investigation on the spot by the Senior
British Commissioner to be followed (a) by a
preliminary investigation of political points by a
Civil Commission sitting at Kisumu, and (b) by a
survey in the field by a Joint Commission, the
British Section of which would consist of a Senior
British Commissioner, who would be accompanied by
technical officers, together with a political

accompanied by a political officer and by a medical officer and a military expert. Lieutenant Colonel King will be asked to base his estimate for local transport on the probable cost of such transport for the complete British Section, ~~but~~ as separate transport may not be provided by the Colonial Government for the Civil Officers who will be accompanying the other British Commissioner.

3. A regular and definite estimate of the cost of local staffs as distinct from the staffs sent from this country, I shall be glad if you will furnish me at the earliest possible date with an estimate in detail of the cost which you consider would arise for Imperial funds. In this connection, it appears to me that the expenses of the Foreign Office, while the expenses of officers such as the Senior Commissioner in the Kenya Administrative Service, the Military Officer, &c., will receive in the Senior British Staff, a fixed sum for their services, or to serve, or to be engaged for the time I have said, and continue to do so during all civil wars, the additional expense entailed on extra funds to be appropriated for the sake of the Senior Commissioner, & giving him additional expenditure may be allowed for an representative expenditure of which Kenya should be relieved under the general principle which has been adopted by the Lord Commissioners of the Treasury.


I am etc., to acknowledge the receipt of your letter of 17th June, S.25367, relative to the appointment of the British personnel of the Boundary Commission set up under the Anglo-Italian treaty of July 15th 1924, for the cession of territory in East Africa to the Italian Government.

2. The Army Council have been approached with a view to the selection and appointment of the additional personnel subject to the concurrence of their Lordships in the rates of remuneration proposed, and further communication will be addressed to you on this point in due course.

3. With regard to the Estimate of the total cost of the Commission which was promised by the letter from this Office of 8th April last, 15149/25,

I also ascertain that, after the total of the
Colonial Services Entitlements as a whole for the
current financial year was sanctioned by Their
Lordships, the ~~Commission~~ under Subhead H, which
was recognized as being a provisional figure,

was reduced by a sum of £1,000 to enable

the ~~Commission~~ to be inclined for certain
allowances without increasing the total of
the estimate.

1. As regards the expense in your letter
of £1,000 for the revision of £1,000 for this
allowance in respect of the ~~Commission~~ for Colonial
affairs, I do not share your estimate of the
allowance which you have mentioned, and
will advise you of the same as soon as
possible. This amount has been expressed
by Mr. G. W. H. ... R. L. H., the senior
Aide-de-Camp, proposing a ~~revisional~~ estimate
of £1,000 as a sum to offset the possible
loss of the ~~Commission~~ in 26. I am requested that
you bring up the Secretary of State with further
information as to the actual time to be incurred
in making a complete estimate of
allowances and to advise of the omission to
make a submission to their Lordships. I
have enclosed a copy of a letter which has been
addressed to Mr. ... Kenya asking that he will
fix the regularity of State with an estimate of the
allowances required in connection with the
present Commission.

With reference to part of the set of Preliminary Financial Instructions which accompanied the letter from this office of 15th April 1925, 17100/25 I am etc to transmit to you, for your information, and for such observations as you may be able to offer on points of detail, a provisional estimate which has been drawn up in this office of the probable cost in the financial year ending 31st March 1926 of the British Section of the Anglo-Italian Commission for the delimitation of the territory ceded to the Italian Govt. under the Treaty of July 15, 1924.

and three Non-Commissioned Officers of Royal Engineers, and of the technical and other stores which it may be necessary to purchase, and ~~as~~ the cost of local transport for the period during which the Commission is engaged on the work of Survey, including, in that connection, the cost of any local transport which it may be necessary to engage for the local staff to be attached to the British Section of the Commission during the work in the field, e.g.

a political officer, the medical officer, and the military escort.

g. I am also to explain that in the absence of present of any exact information as to the probable duration of the work of the Commission, the names and rates of pay of the additional personnel to be sent out from this country, and of the post of local transport for the British Section, the figures in the Estimate now enclosed must be accepted as provisional figures only which will be subject to modification when more precise information is available. Meanwhile I am to draw attention to the following points on which further information is required and to make the following remarks:-

Pay

It will be observed that the Estimate for pay and allowances has been framed on the assumption that the Commission will remain in Africa until the 31st of December next, and that the sum paid for pay after that date will be confined to pay during the voyage home, and for such period as is necessary to bring the members of the British Section

completed on the basis of pay dictated as soon as the exact rates, on set off the additional personnel have been settled.

Subsistence.

It will be observed that the Estimate under the above heading is confined to the cost of maintenance of the three Non-Commissioned Officers of Royal Engineers, for the whole period of their employment with the exception of the period of the voyages out and home and of any leave to which they may be entitled after return to this country.

Local Transport.

I am to ask that you will furnish me at as early a date as possible with an Estimate in such detail as may be considered desirable of the probable cost of such local transport as it may be necessary to engage for the British Section of the Commission while employed on the work in the field. With this object allowance should be made for the cost of any transport which it may be necessary to engage for the local staff to be attached to the British Section.

4. I am to add that a communication being addressed to the O.A.G. Kenya in which he is being asked to furnish the Secretary of State with an estimate of the cost of the local staff which may be required for the work of the Boundary Commission, exclusive of the cost of any local transport for such local staff as may be specially attached to the British Section for the particular work of Survey in the field.

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I am to take this opportunity of
informing you that as soon as all arrangements with
respect to the selection of the additional
personnel and the despatch of the provisions,
stores etc., for the full Imperial contingent
have been settled, the arrangements made will
be embodied in a supplementary paper of
Financial Instructions which will be communicated
to you for your information and guidance as
soon as possible.
