Sir,

I have laid before the Lords Commissioners of His Majesty's Treasury Mr. Bottomley's letter of the 20th instant (59561/1924) relative to the Bill which has been introduced into Parliament in order to give approval to the recent Treaty for the transfer of territory in Kenya to the Government of Italy.

In reply I am to request you to inform the Secretary of State for the Colonies that my Lords have agreed to re-insert in the Estimates for Colonial Services 1925/26 provision of £6,000 in respect of the anticipated expenses of frontier defence and that they accept generally the principle that the expense should fall on Kenya in this matter.

My Lords agree to the proposal in paragraph 4 of the letter under reply. With regard to paragraph 5 they are not prepared to give an assurance to recognise claims
