Gentlemen,

I am etc. to inform you that the Ag. Governor of Kenya has recommended that Miss Janet C. Bell, whose address is to the Matron's Office, St Thomas's Hospital, S.E. should be engaged for service as Matron at the James Teachers Training School College in the Colony.

2. Satisfactory replies have been received from the referees named by Miss Bell, and I am now to

authorise you to offer her,
subject to medical examⁿ,
engagement for the usual
term of service on a Class "A"
Agreement, with salary
on the scale £200 a year
by increments of £15 to £300.

3. Miss Bell is required
to commence duty in the
Colony by the end of May
next, and you should
therefore arrange for her to
sail not later than
the 30th 2nd.

4. The A. G. Governor
makes no mention of the
payment of Uniform Allowance
in this case, and it is deemed
that no provision for this is
made in the annual Estimates
of the Colony. In the event,
therefore, if Miss Bell enquires
on this point
~~as to the payment of such~~
~~allowance~~, you should
inform her that you have

no authority to offer any such allowance, & that she should raise the matter for consideration by the local Govt on her arrival in the Colony.

5. I am to request you to report as soon as possible whether Mr Bell accepts employment on these conditions.
