I have received a letter from Lieut. L. R.

anley M.P. to send you information about a claim for land in Kenya Colony. It dates back from 1901 when I went out as guide and intelligence Officer under Capt. Wake C.M.G., D.S.O. East African Fiftes on the Kalayere Punative Expedition. I joined the expedition at waivasha and the reason I went was because I was the only white man that had ever been there and knew the country I took my whole Safari ith me which consisted of about fifty men my own rifles and ammunition also secured 3,000 Volunteers some of my friendly Natives and after even weeks of hard fighting I managed to put the whole country in order ing incidently shooting the rebel Chief Kasusa myself in a cave . I ever received any remuneration for my services but was promised a farm nd received a letter from Capt. Make stating that it had been placed or coord at headquarters but up to date have not received any satisfaction lthough I have seen different Gevernors of the colony in the matter

I have given full consideration to your application for another farm at Myeri and have read through all the papers.

As I told you at the time you spoke to me, I am afrathat there was little chance. Your services were rendered a very long time ago as things move in Kenya, and even if I and my Executive Council did recommend a grant, I am sure the secretary of State would not agree. The circumstances are so diagram owing to the lapse of time that the matter would have to be referred to longon.

I am sorry that under the conditions I am afraid I cannot help you in this matter.
