

In September last acting on your advice I wrote to Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, Kenya Colony, asking scheme for granting farms to Medical men on condition that they should practise medicine in that country in operation. In November I received an answer that the scheme was still in operation & sending list of seven farms to select from. I made a trip in December 1924 & made my preparations and to Kenya this year. I have now received the latter from the Commissioner of Lands, Nairobi, that the scheme is now, in suspension. This change of policy has caused me "great inconvenience".
