Sir,

I am directed by Mr. Secretary Amery to inform you that, subject to your being passed as physically fit for service, it is proposed to select you for employment as an Assistant in the amalgamated Customs Department of Kenya and Uganda with salary at the rate of £400 a year, rising by annual increments of £20 to £500 a year. An outfit allowance of £30 will be payable on first appointment.

2. Memoranda showing generally the conditions attached to appointments in East Africa, the Pensions Regulations, and the pay arrangements in force, are enclosed herewith. You should, however, understand that you will be subject to any regulations which may be introduced hereafter by or with the sanction of the Secretary of State for the Colonies. A copy of the

cial Regulations is also enclosed

3. You will be accounted in the first instance
the home service for a tour of from 20 to 30
months in East Africa, with the leave incidental
thereto, on the understanding that the period of
accountment (including passages and leave as
on the time spent in East Africa) shall not
exceed three years. At the end of that period you
will either be confirmed in your appointment on the
same establishment in East Africa, if your
tour there has been satisfactory and you are still
required by the Government, or you may revert to the
home service. In the former case you will retain your
seniority in respect of your service at home,
and you will be eligible for promotion on your home service
in accordance with the provisions of No.
1 of the Rules of the Staff of July 1911. framed

under

under Section 7 (1) of the Superannuation Act 1909. If on the other hand, you revert to the Home service and ultimately retire from that service under conditions qualifying you for pension, you will receive pensions calculated separately in respect of your service in East Africa and your Home service in the manner explained above.

4. In the event of a male officer of the Home Civil Service who is subject to the terms of the Imperial Superannuation Act of 1909, and is seconded for service in East Africa, dying during the period of his seconded service, the death gratuity contemplated by that Act (i.e. the equivalent of the annual salary and emoluments of his appointment in the Home service at the date of seconding) will be paid by the Colonial Government to his legal personal representatives, provided that he has completed 5 years established service, whether such service has been wholly or only partly in the Home service. If at the end of the period of seconding the officer accepts permanent transfer to the service of the Colonial Government, he then becomes
subject

subject to the pension regulations in force for officers in that service, and the special arrangement described in this paragraph no longer applies.

5. If you are prepared to accept the appointment on these conditions you should present yourself for examination to one of the Medical Advisers to this Department whose names are given on the enclosed letter for the purpose of being medically examined. The letter is to be left with the Medical Adviser and you will be required to pay a fee of one and a half guineas. He will send his report direct to this Department. You should also fill up the enclosed medical history form and hand it to the Medical Adviser when you present yourself for examination.

6. I am to request that you will state whether you accept this offer, and if so, that you will inform me of the earliest date on which you will be prepared to leave for East Africa.

7. You should, at the same time, furnish me with an address to which communications intended for your relatives or friends may be sent during your

your absence from this country.
