I enclose apetition from Mrs. Fernandes, widow of the late Mr. L. J.Fernandes, First Grade Clerk, Treasury for relief from public funds, and recommend it for favourable consideration.

- 2. Mr. Fernandes joined the service of this Government on the 7th of March 1898, and retired after completing over 26 years service, on the 14th of July 1924 on a pension of She.3075-71 a year. He died on the 11th of June 1925.
- 3. This case is similar to that referred to in His Excellency's despatch to the Colonial Office No.965 of the 5th of August 1925. I am satisfied as to the widow's destitution and recommend her for a compassionate gratuity amounting to six month's salary of her deceased husband.
- 1. I observe that under Head I of the Form of Particulars a sum of £139 has been inserted; this represents pension of the late Mr. Fernandes which ceased on his death.

 The correct figure under this Head should, therefore, he £299.
- 5. I would add that these cases emphasise the desirability of the institution of a Provident or Widows! & Orphans' Pensions Fund for Asians.
