Sir,

I have the honour to transmit for your consideration the prescribed form of application, in duplicate, for relief from public funds duly completed by the widow of the late Mr. D. F. Lobo, 2nd Grade Clerk, H. M's Customs, Mombasa.

2. Mr. Lobo joined the Customs Department on the 1st of May, 1917, and was latterly posted as Superintendent of Customs at Vanga, where he contracted Black Water Fever and died at Mombasa on the 25th of August, 1925.

3. In view of the circumstances of the death of the petitioner's husband, and the fact that she is left to support four dependents, I desire to recommend the grant to his widow of a gratuity equivalent to 6 months' pay of the deceased Officer.

4. I am informed by the Commissioner of Customs that prior to his decease Mr. Lobo did in fact maintain and support his wife and family and it would therefore appear that in paragraph II of the attached form Mrs. Lobo intends to convey that she is not now in

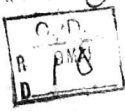
