I have discussed the matter with Sir John Risley and, although I know ar. Harrage and li to do him a good turn, I agree with Sir John Ribley that it would be doing an injustice to others to put Mr. Harragin over their heads. In the circumstances I recommend that we should be guided by \$1r John Risley and offer the appointment in the first instance to Mr. Gordon Smith of Northern Shodesta, and failing him, to Mr. Purpess, the Solicitor General of Tripland. I do not think, from the point of wiew of the Colonial Service, we can be too careful about giving appointments to the men who appear best qualified from their record of service and have the strongest claims, and although I should be the last to advocate the appointment of a man simply because he happened to be rirst in order of moniority I think it should only be in the most exceptional cases that junior officer should be singled out for promotion simply because he happens to know a Governor or some

other officer in the Colony where the vacancy exists. I am calling your attention to this correspondence because I am getting a little perturbed about the number of requests we are getting from Sir Edward Grigg, and other Governors, to have men appointed to fill vacancies over the heads of candidates in the Colonial Service who are considered fully qualified.
