MINUTES

With the exception of the Governor of Tanganyika (Para 2 of X612) the Councils considered the arrangements in favouring the retention of the present arrangements.

The Colonial Legislation (No. 1125) referred to by the Governor of Tanganyika, I take it, that any satisfaction of a matter should be as far as possible be credited, for leave purposes, to next office next time. If this arrangement were adopted, it would presumably get rid of the question of steamer irregularity in an equitable way. But if there is any hope of the service eventually regularising itself and it is thought undesirable

Sir,

I have the honour to acknowledge the receipt of your Despatch No. 1947 of the 15th of December and to inform you that I approve of the present system, whereby 30 days or more of the final month of an officer's tour of service may be counted for leave purposes as a full month, being retained for another year.

2. The Governor of Tanganyika Territory has, however, suggested that, instead of extending the present arrangements indefinitely it would be more satisfactory for the East African Dependencies to adopt the system in force in West Africa and provided for in Colonial Regulation No. 122, whereby any extra fraction of a month served by an officer on one tour may be credited, for the purpose of calculation of leave, to his next tour. I should be glad to receive your observations as to the advisability of adopting this system in West Africa.
