E.A.C.7. Following is summary of first two days work of Conference. At the first meeting we discussed general conduct (of) work and agreed to model as much as possible on Imperial Conference 1923. We then agreed order of items on agenda but owing to Stanley's absence have been obliged to discuss any matters on preliminary basis only with a view to final discussion after his arrival.

As regards items to you suggest sending you telegraphic summaries of progress made at intervals. Items dealt with during first days some of which postponed for further consideration (i) Air Surveys of Khartoum, Kisumu Route. For this Gladstone and Cunningham Royal Air Force attend. (ii) Wireless (iii) Postal (iv) Roads (v) Various questions affecting inland transport (vi) Defence including King's African Rifles organisation the question of Northern frontier referred to sub-committee Harrington Inspector General attends for this (vii) Police Training and Organisation (viii) Various minor questions affecting natives major ones are being taken later with your despatches on labour policy and organisation.
