Sir,

With reference to Kenya despatch, Confidential, No. 224 (2), dated the 29th January, 1924, relative to the service of Mr. V. P. Virjee, late 1st Class Clerk in the Attorney General's Office, in the Uganda Railway being regarded as pensionable, I have the honour to transmit herewith a form of particulars required for the computation of pension payable to him.

2. As stated in Kenya despatch, No. 222, Confidential, of the 7th December, 1923, Mr. Virjee has been pronounced unfit for further service in this Colony by a medical Board held on him at Nairobi on the 10th March, 1923, and I now enclose a copy of the proceedings of the medical Board for your information.

3. Mr. Virjee's service date from the 10th January, 1903, and he is, therefore, eligible for a pension in respect of twenty completed years of service. The pension is computed at Sh. 2800/- a year with effect from the 29th August, 1923, inclusive.

4. Pending the receipt of your sanction to the pension recommended, I have authorised the grant of an alimentary allowance at the rate of Sh. 1800/- a year with effect from the date of his retirement.

5. Mr. Virjee has been informed of your decision regarding his request that his Railway Service should be regarded as pensionable.


