I attach a map showing the position of these farms.

MAR: 2. All these farms have been surveyed as Crown Lands for alienation and therefore any occupation by natives except under the Resident Natives Ordinance 33, 1918, and the Master and Servants Amendment Ordinance 7/1924, would have been unlawful. The question of actual occupation by natives was referred to the Chief Native Commissioner, who stated that he had no record of any native settlement upon them.

3. The Resident Commissioners of Kitale and Kisumu, in whose districts these farms are situated, were then asked if any natives were, to their knowledge, living on them.

Kenya Tel. of 7th August, 1924: I attach a map showing the position of these farms.

MAP: 2. All these farms have been surveyed as Crown lands for alienation and therefore any occupation by natives except under the Resident Natives Ordinance 33, 1918, and the Master and Servants Amendment Ordinance 7/1924, would have been unlawful. The question of actual occupation by natives was referred to the Chief Native Commissioner, who stated that he had no record of any natives living upon them.

3. The Resident Commissioners of Kitale and Kisumu, in whose districts these farms are situated, were then asked if any natives were, to their knowledge, living on them.

They both reported that the farms were unoccupied by natives.
 Copies of their reports are attached. I do not consider
 that any native question arises in this connection.

Reports:

4. As regards unsuccessful applicants under the Soldier Settlement Scheme, I am advised that none of these areas contain farms suitable for small holders without capital, though divisible into 1000 acres blocks and suitable for settlers of some means.

5. It is the case that the titles for the land to be exchanged in the Highlands will provide for full development conditions as laid down in the Crown Lands Ordinance, 1915, while as regards the Coast and Taveta areas the old conditions of the original lease stand without diminution in spite of the large decrease in area.

6. Moreover, the Company will acquire land in the Highlands suitable for the production of coffee and maize in a large scale, and in this way capital will be attracted to the country and two of the principal crops of the Colony will receive encouragement.

7. As was pointed out in the despatch under reference, a large area at the Coast will be obtained for cultivation, especially in social conditions, in a region where there is no opportunity for agriculture and where there are no facilities for settlement.

8. I trust, therefore, that in view of the advantages to be gained, you will approve the exchange as recommended.

I would point out that commitments entered into by the East African Estates Company, in respect of areas in their Coast concession cannot be met until the whole exchange proposition is settled, while as regards the new Highland areas to be granted them, the Company's local representative strong-


