2. Grant of honorary King's commissions to selected senior sub-assistant surgeons of the Indian Medical Department.

It has been decided, with the approval of the Secretary of State for India, to grant honorary King's commissions, as captains and lieutenants, to selected senior sub-assistant surgeons of the Indian Medical Department holding the rank of subadar-major or subadar, who have rendered distinguished service. The conditions governing the grant of these commissions are set forth in the appendix to this instruction.

3. Recommendations for the grant of such commissions to selected senior sub-assistant surgeons of the Indian Medical Department should be submitted to the Adjutant General in India before the 31st January 1922.

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

Entry of Service Instruction

536. Revision of the pay and conditions of service of sub-assistant surgeons of the Indian Medical Department.

14th July
1922.

With reference to Army Instructions (India) No. 1486 of 1918 and No. 689 of 1919, it has been decided, with the approval of the Right Honorable the Secretary of State for India, that in place of the existing classes and pay, the following classification, with the revised rate of pay as shown against each, shall be introduced with effect from the 28th April 1922:

Classification.	Revised rate of pay per month.
Warrant officers	Rs. 70
Jemadars	75 - 5 - 145
Subadars	160 - 5 - 175
Subadar-Majors	200 plus Rs. 70 personal allowance

Sub-assistant surgeons who now rank as Jemadar or Subadar will be brought on to the new rates of pay in the manner applicable to incremental salaries under article 157-A of the Civil Service Regulations.

2. There will be efficiency bars at 5 and 10 years' service.

3. Subadars will form 10 per cent. of the sanctioned establishment and promotion to that rank will be made by selection only. As regards Subadar-Majors, the existing Army Instruction conditions* governing the grant of India No. 689 of 1919, promotion to that rank will be maintained.

4. Separate orders will be issued on the question whether the personal allowances of Rs. 50 sanctioned for those classed as Subadar-Major should continue on their transfer to the pension establishment.

5. Pending further orders pensions will continue to be assessed on the rates of pay which were in force before the publication of this Instruction.


