I am commanded by the Army Council to inform you that in future all demands for vaccine for the inoculation of officials proceeding abroad in the service of the Colonial Office should be addressed to the Commandant, Royal Army Medical College, Grosvenor Road, London, S.W.1.

I am further to add that it has been found necessary to make a small charge of approximately sixpence per dose.

It should be noted that the Officer should, if possible, attend at the Royal Army Medical College for inoculation, otherwise he should give the address of the civil medical practitioner who is prepared to inoculate him.
