MINUTES

I rang up Captain Ashley, (M.I.C.A.) yesterday morning and verified my impression (from the maps which we have returned) that the portion of the Kenya-Abyssinia boundary shown on the "Abyssinia" sheet, consisted only of a few ~~several~~ miles ^{Scor} immediately to the east of Lake Rudolf. I also ascertained that there is no special urgency from the point of view of the War Office General Series in proceeding with the "Kenya" sheet (on which the rest of the boundary will be shown), but that the Uganda Railway are in a hurry for a map of Kenya for the purpose of their annual report. I am agreed subject to official confirmation, to the War Office showing the Maud line on the "Abyssinia" sheet, and also to their showing the de facto Kenya-Uganda boundary west of Lake Rudolf; but I asked that on the Uganda-Railway map the Gwynne line should be shown for the rest of the Abyssinia boundary, pending a discussion of the matter with the Governor of Kenya.

The Director of Military Operations and Intelligence presents his compliments to the Under Secretary of State for the Colonies and begs to acknowledge the receipt of his letter dated December 22nd, 1924 concerning the sheet "Abyssinia" of the 1:8,000,000 series of Africa, and of the map referred to therein.

The question of the southern boundary of Abyssinia was revived owing to the receipt of documents from Kenya Colony, during the past twelve months, which show that the Colonial Government do not recognise the line, as at present given on the maps published by the Geographical Section of the General Staff, as the correct one. In October last a copy of one of these maps was received from the Land Survey Dept. in which the boundary had been corrected to agree with that surveyed by Captain Maud in 1902-3, and laid down in the Agreement of December 6th, 1907, and it is also noted that in the descriptions of provinces and boundaries appearing in the Special Issue of the ^{Official} Kenya Gazette of February 29th, 1924, Captain Maud's boundary is quoted. As this is directly

directly contrary to the Colonial Office policy expressed in the letter dated December 22nd, 1924, Major General Sir John Burnett Stuart would be glad to receive any further remarks in Henry Lambert may have to make on this matter before a further communication is sent from here to the Foreign Office, who have already requested the War Office that Captain Maud's boundary be shown in place of that surveyed by Major Gwynn.

With regard to the observations of the Secretary of State for the Colonies on the subject of the Kenya-Uganda boundary, Major General Sir John Burnett Stuart would be glad to be informed if he has any objection to the line, agreed upon by the Governments of Kenya and Uganda and observed in practice, being now shown on new editions of War Office maps.

An early reply would be much appreciated, as the printing of two maps, which it is desired to publish as soon as possible, is now being held up until a decision can be arrived at as to the line to be shown in each case.


