Sir,

I am directed to refer to your letter - No. 28509/1924 of the 30th ultimo, with enclosures, regarding the amounts due to this Department in respect of sales of salvage stores by Messrs. Hogg and Moynagh.

It is noted that according to the records of the Officer in Charge, East African War Accounts, Clearance Section, a sum of Shs. 44,424.28 is shown as outstanding as at 31st March, 1923, but I am to ask if further information can be furnished regarding the amount of Fls. 6426.49 stated to have been paid to the Customs Commissioner in connection with these sales.

I am also to refer to Colonial Office letter - No. 55795/1923 - of the 8th December, 1923, with enclosures, setting forth the position regarding the amounts outstanding.

A sum of £5. 7. 0. was received by this Department through the Crown Agents for the Colonies on the 19th June last, but no further payments have yet been received.

It is desired to close the account against Messrs. Hogg and Moynagh in the books of this Department as early as possible, and if you agree, perhaps you will be good enough to cause enquiries to be made as to when payment for the outstanding balances will be made, including the sum of Rs. 3750 payable by Messrs. Hogg and Moynagh, and referred to in paragraph 13 of the Acting Solicitor General's letter of the 15th August, 1923, a copy of which was enclosed with Colonial Office letter of the 8th December, 1923.
