I am to observe that the attitude of the Postmastra General of the Colony scarcely appears to be consistent with the pressure which he is endeavouring to bring to bear on the Company for reduced rates.

Dear Sir,

We recently requested the Officer in Charge, Mombaea, to supply us with a copy of the Post Office Guide desired by the Government of Kenya. The Guide itself is dated 1917 and is therefore obsolete from the point of view of the Cable rates quoted therein, but a supplement dated January 1923 gives rates in shillings and cents, which we cannot reconcile with the notified franc charges calculated at the equivalent of the franc of 0.79297 shilling published in Berne Notification No. 840 of the 1st November 1923.

Taking the ordinary rate to Europe as an example, which is notified at Fr. 2.80 or 243d per word, we find that the Kenya Government are collecting shillings 2.50 or 28.6d which means an extra charge for the public of 25 cents or 3d per word. The other rates are more or less in proportion viz:-

In view of the frequent requests by Chambers of Commerce and other interests for reductions in the pable rates to India etc., it would appear that a substantial amount of reduction could be obtained for the benefit of the public by the simple process of adjustment of the currency charges collected by the Government.

Moreover the cases of Aden and India are particularly noteworthy as the Government apparently collect the same charge from Mombasa as from up-dountry offices although the notified franc rates are .35 centimes cheaper and the Company debit 13 centimes less on Mombasa traffic.
