Sir,

I have to report having examined the applications and interviewed a number of candidates for the post of Agricultural Assistant in the Department of Agriculture, Nairobi, and that am unable to recommend the appointment of any one of them as, in my opinion, none of them is suitable owing to lack of either of sufficient ability and experience, or both.

On my return to Nairobi I propose to advise H.M. the Governor that an endeavour should be made to get a suitable man from South Africa. There is a number of men there who have been trained in England, in the United States and elsewhere.

As discussed in conversation with Major Forst, I should be glad if you would advise the Governor-General of the Union of South Africa that, in the event of posts being advertised in South Africa by the Government of Kenya he should transmit the applications or the prescribed form to the Governor of Nairobi. That would save time.

2. In this connection I have to

submitted by Mr. Canney in support of his application
for the post of Principal Assistant.

Orr dated 15.6.25.

(d) A copy of a letter from my

Private Secretary (Appointments) to

Mr. C. S. Orwin dated 26.6.25

(e) A copy of Mr. Orwin's reply dated

30.6.25.

(f) A copy of a paper by Mr. Canney

on Rain-grown Cotton and Climate.

3. Mr. Canney has been satisfactorily

reported on by the Army Council. He

was seen by my Private Secretary

(Appointments) in 1921 and made a

very favourable impression. The Director

of Kew Gardens also saw him and considered

him to be a useful type of man. The

Director feared, however, that his training

at that time had fitted him better for a

post at home than for employment in a

Department of Agriculture in the Tropics.

4. In view of Mr. Orwin's remarks made by ^{the}
in his letter a copy of which is enclosed
I hardly anticipate that you will con-

consider Mr. Canney suitable for the
appointment of Agricultural Assistant.

I think it desirable, however, to
~~knowing an~~
give you the opportunity of ~~mentioning~~

Opinion — his application as he appears to be
the best candidate who has come forward
up to the present time in spite of the
vacancy having been advertised in 1933
and 1934. It has also occurred to me
that in the absence of an entirely
suitable candidate for the post of
Agricultural Assistant you might consider
the desirability of the appointment of a

Senior Supervisor supplementary to the
establishment *as an alternative*.

5. I should be glad to be informed
of your views ~~regarding~~ ~~on~~ regarding Mr. Canney by
telegram.
