

Cold Storage (Dairy) at Mombasa.

1. In connection with the above project, my contact with firms interested in Refrigerated produce, and in Refrigeration machinery, very properly cause question to arise which I am unable to answer.
2. The chief question is the possibility of merging Dairy and Meat installations in to one mechanical unit.
3. It would be of value if I could be placed in a position to discuss, at my discretion, the details of "The Government Scheme" in connection with the Dairy Industry.
4. I would suggest that the file on this subject in your office, and in the Crown Agents may be made available to me at some specified hour.
5. Allowing, the following on the queries most commonly put, and to these I would trust quilling replies:-
- (1) The area of the space to be insulated, and the size of the Compressor.
 - (2) The practicability of insulating this space without change of Compressor, and what temperature could be maintained in this situation.

- ③ Is the design of construction suitable for meat, fish, eggs and fruit storage in addition to keep Butter and Cheese.
- ④ Will the Store be contiguous to the new Pier.
- ⑤ The terms which the Kenya Government propose to demand in return for the estimated expenditure of £25,000.
- ⑥ Would the Kenya Government offer facilities for private enterprise to erect and maintain adequate cold storage equivalent to that now projected.




