

Heap S —In cases of introduct, it the applicant is below the ordinary age for retirement, a Medical Cortificate is to be furrished showing that he is disqualified by infrinity of mind or body for discharging the duties of his situation, and that such infririnty is highly 65 be permanent.

In case of ten years' service or more, this certificate should be algued by two Officers, whom at least one should, if passible, be a Salaried Officer of the Government.
