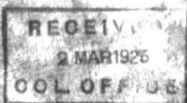

2. The allowances will be free of income tax and the allow^{ance} to Lady Comynson will be payable for life, except in the event of her re marriage, when it would cease. The allow^{ance} in the case of the sons will continue until they attain the age of 21 and that to the daughter until she reaches that age, unless she marries in the interval, in which case the allow^{ance} would cease. The allow^{ances} to the children will be vested in trustees.
