Annoyed enough I have been asked if I could make enquiries regarding another Colonial Office appointment that of a Crown Counsel Nairobi. Mr. J. A. Watson who is a barrister to the Queen in Scotland and has had an appointment in Kenya for years, an applicant for the post of Crown Counsel. His application was turned down the ground that only a barrister need apply. He says this is not right because the very General told him that he was particularly anxious to get a solicitor one of the vacancies (there are, I am at least 2 vacancies for Crown and in the office).

I am told that there is nothing in Colonial Office regulations forbidding such appointments to barristers, that a solicitor was appointed at Magistrate not long ago. I shall be grateful if you

Dear Thomson,

I have been looking into the case of Mr. J.A. Watson of Kenya. I find that when the vacancy for Crown Counsel occurred in Kenya we telegraphed to the Officer Administering the Government to say that Mr. Watson desired to become a candidate and in reply we were informed that the Officer Administering the Government after consultation with the Attorney General could not recommend him in view of his age and the fact that he was not a barrister. I might add that unless (which is not the case in the present instance) the appointment of a solicitor had been specially requested for the vacancy, the appointment would normally go to a barrister.
