We consider that our position would be greatly tamage: if the rritory in question is ceded to the Italian Covernment, for the llowing reasons:-

We could not expect anything like the same help from the Italian Government, that we could get from the British.

Further capital which was to be jut in the concern will not be put up, if it is transferred, indeed the here rumour has prevented our getting it.

Fast experience has shown to us that the Italians have never been able to control the Somalie and abyssinian raiders, who used

to raid the River Juba, till held back by the British.

The more we make our settlement at Towata a success, the rore they will raid.

The Natives there would funk and bolt.

It will be practically impossible for us to get labour from British Territories.

Previous experience in this region and others is that the resent local labour will migrate to British Territories and leave s high and dry.

It is more than linely that various tariffs will be at on to ar disadvantage, more or less forcing us to buy all our Lachinery etc. from Italy, and also to offer our produce to Italy.

We have some three to four thousand natives on our up river tate, to whom we have given Cotton Seed, and have had one of our .. 4, ers up there, instructing them how to cultivate.

This we know would be wasted labour once the listrict passed t of British hands.

There is no precedent in Colonial history in which a British vernment has ceded the future of a British Company to a Foreign er.

We trust that this Government will not sell the comme rial erests of British Lettlers to a Foreign lower.

We therefore feel that we have a very just claim or the vernment for compensation, should the cession take place.

We feel sure that after reading your speech, we shall get ir and just treatement, to which we think we are entitled.
