Sir,

I have the honour to transmit for your consideration the prescribed form of application for relief from public funds duly completed by the widow of Hamisi bin Suleiman, late Office Boy, Treasury, Mombasa.

2. The Treasurer reports that Hamisi had completed 10 years service, a period by no means small in the case of employees of this nature, and had always been reported upon, as honest, regular and satisfactory in the performance of his duties. The widow is destitute, and on account of her old age, is unable to support herself, and is entirely dependent on her neighbours for food and shelter.

3. Mr. Ormsby, in his despatch No. 302 of the 30th March, 1925, sanctioned the payment in similar circumstances of a gratuity to the widow of Joseph, late Office Messenger, Government House, and in consideration of the poverty of the widow of Hamisi bin Suleiman and of late husband's faithful service to Government, I recommend for your approval
