With reference to your despatch No.720 of

the 4th of August on the subject of the removal of certain natives from the Loldaika Hills, I have the honour to inform you that I am satisfied that the return of any of these people to the Loldaika Hills with their stock would involve serious risk to their neighbours' cattle through the spread of disease. It is stated by the Senior Commissioner of the Province that they are quite happy in their present surroundings.

2. I am further informed that the Samburu have returned to live amongst their fellow-tribesmen in the Samburu District of the Northern Frontier Province north of the Uaso Nyiro. I am causing enquiries to be made regarding this and I will communicate with you further on the matter if it is necessary to qualify this information in any way.

3. It appears that the area mentioned in paragraph 4 of Mr. Denham's despatch No.760 of 17th June is not favoured by the Mogogodo and Wanderobo; alternative localities were examined but were found unsuitable, and I

concur with the recommendation of the Acting Chief Native Commissioner, viz., that they should remain for the present in the Mogogoo Hills. This area is well within the large Quarantine Reserve of 800 square miles and I am advised that they can remain there without harm to others or disadvantage to themselves.
