I regret to inform you that Mr.P. F. Whiting of the Uganda Railway died in nospital on the lst instant. mer. Whi ting was admitted. to noepital on the 28th instant with malaria, his temperature was 1030 and pulse 104, examination showed no signs of wisceral disease. He had had a temperature for some days past and had been delicious with very high temperature and had had about rifteen grains of quinine during the two days previous to his admission. was given 10 grains of quinine intramuscularly and three grains of calorel at once. wext norming the temperature was down to lov.4 and pulse to 92 and he felt much better. Quinine was then given at the rate of 30 grains daily by mouth and patient remained fairly well until the night of the 31st when his pulse was very poor and was 112 and irregular, the temperature was 1020. The next morning at 7 a.m. his pulse began to fail rapidly and despite digitalin injections his heart failed and he died at lo minutes to 8.2.m. I beg to remain, Sir, Yours obediently,
