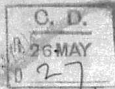

I am etc. to request you to inform the L.C. of the Treasury that an opportunity has arisen of securing the appointment of a Donation Governor of Christ's Hospital on behalf of the ^{Sent to the} Tanganyika Territory.

2. I am to explain that a payment of £500 ^{will secure the apppt of} renders the donor eligible for a Donation Governorship. A Donation Governor has the privilege of presenting children for free admission to Christ's Hospital as "foundationers", for a period of 20 years, from the date of his appointment, or until his death, if this occurs before the expiration of the

20 years. He may have two presented children at one time in the Boys and Girls Schools of Christ's Hospital.
