The Tanganyika fort should guarantee the
 firm regular interest on the capital outlay
 involved. I cannot imagine the Treasury
 consenting to any such proposal, and,
 indeed, as everything must turn upon the
 regular supply of stock required, and as
 such regular supply seems very doubtful, it
 looks as though the fort might have to
 go on paying indefinitely on account of
 the guarantee if the scheme came into
 operation.

The cattle position in Northern Rhodesia,
 where the local forts have entered into
 an arrangement with the Imperial
 Cold Storage Co. as these lines seem to be
 quite different from those in Tanganyika
 & it seems impossible to argue from one
 to the other.
