King's African Rifles Clearance Section.

2. The recommendation in paragraph (ii) of Kenys
despatch No.14 King's African Rifles of the 22nd September
1920, was to the effect that Captain Nicolson should be

engaged at Florins 1,440/- per mensem inclusive of all allowances. The question of his pay, however, was left open pending consultation with the War Office.

3. I enclose for ready reference a copy of the Agreement with Schedule dated the 18th January, 1921, entered into by the Craum Agents for the Colonies with Captain Nivelson. Faragraph 4 of the Schedule clearly shews this officer to be entitled to the usual privileges accorded to Kenya officials, and as no quarters have been available, Captain Nicolson has since April 1921 drawn House Allowance of Shs.432/- per mensem which represents 15% of his salary.

4. As desired Captain Nicolson has been informed that the allowance must not be drawn pending further instructions.

AGREEMENT made the 18th day of JANUARY 1921, between the Grown Agents for the Colonies, London; acting on behelf of the Government of the Menya Colony (hiroinafter Equigation Government) and Alexander Nicolash of Medilworth Hotel, Great Russell Stroot, London W.S.1 (hereinafter dalled the person engaged).

1. The person angaged agrees to proceed to the Kenya Calon

- (hereinefter called the Colony) when end as directed by the Crown Agenta for the Colonics, and undertakes that he will there diligently and faithfully perform the duties of Officer in Charge Clearance Scotler, King's African Rifles Accounts for the term of his engagement, and will act in all respects according to the imperiorisms or directions given to him by the Government through the Read of his Department or other duly authorized officers.
- In this agreement the term "Head of his Department" shell rean the person for the time being noting as Head of his Department.

 2. The salary of the office is at the rate of one thousand

four landred and forty floring (1840 floring) a month.

- 1. (1) The engagement of the person engaged is for a tour of not more than six months continuous residential service, commencing from the date of disembarkation at Hombasa.
- 2. The duties of the person engaged shall include the usual duties of the office for which he is engaged, and any other suitable duties which the Government may call upon him to perform. The person engaged shall reside in such place and occupy himself in such manner so the Government, through its duly authorized officers, shall direct, and he shall not, either directly or indirectly, engage or be concerned in any other service or business whatevever or receive commissions or profits of any kind, but shall devote the whole of his time and attention to the service of the Government, and shall use his atmost exertions to promote the interests of the Government.
- 3. (1) On first engagement half salary will be paid from the lat day of January 1921. Full salary will begin from the date of disembarkation at Mombasa.
- 4. Government quarters, free of rent (but not of rates or other similar outgoings), will be provided for similar men when such quarters are available. When such quarters are not available, the person engaged will be provided with a tent or other temporary shelter, or, in certain cases, he will be granted an allowance in lieu of quarters at the disgretion of the lovernment.
- S. When travelling on duty away from his station in the Colony the person engaged either shall be provided with transport or shall be paid travelling expenses according to the scales taid down for transport and travelling expenses respectively in the Colony.
- 6. (1) "Passage" in this agreement means a first class vasuage and includes conveyance by railway, steamer, or other transport between the port of disembarkation and the station of the person engaged in the Colony.

- (8) The Government shall provide the person engaged with a free passage from England to the Colony.
- 7. (1) On the completion of his tour of service the person engaged may, at the discretion of the Government, be granted leave of absence on full salary for the time necessarily spent on the voyage to South Africa and for five days in respect of each month completed of continuous residential service, and shall be provided with a free passage to South Africa by the first opportunity after the completion of his tour ofmservice.
- 8. (1) If the person engaged shall be compelled by reason of ill-health not caused by his own misconduct to resign his appointment or if, at any time, it shall be certified by a duly qualified medical efficer employed by the Covernment that he is incapable on physical grounds of rendering further efficient service in the Colony, the Covernment shall pay him full salary up to but not including the date of departure from Mombasa of the first schamer by which, in the opinion of the Government, he could have embarked, and half salary during the time necessarily spent on the passage to South Africa and shall provide him with a free passage to South Africa provided he embarks by the first opportunity, after such resignation or dertificate, but he chall have no further claim on the Government.
- (2) A certificate signed by a duly qualified medical officer employed by the Government shall be conclusive evidence on the question whether or not the person engaged was compelled to resign his appointment by reason of ill-health within the meaning of this clause.

 9. If the person engaged shall at any time neglect or refuse or from any cause (excepting ill-health not caused by his own misconduct, as provided in clause 8) become unable to perform any of his duties or to comply with any order, or shall disclose any information respecting the affairs of the Government to any person not in the employment of the Government, or shall in any manner misconduct himself, the Government may dismiss him, and on such dismissal all rights and advantages reserved to him by this

agreement shall cease, and he shall be liable to repay to the Government on demand the amount paid for his passage to the Colony.

engagement of the person engaged on giving him one month a notice in writing, or on paying him one month's salary and it either case, if he is in the Colony at the time, furnishing his with a free passage to South Africa provided that he claims and swalls himself of such return passage by the first opportunity after the expiration of his engagement.

expiration of one month from the commencement of his tour of residential service, determine his manual engagement on giving to covernment one Month's notice in writing, or on paying to the court of his passage to the Colony. He shall not in either case be entitled to a return passage to South Africa.

person engaged disregarding or failing to comply with any order, standing order, of departmental instruction, or from any neglect of duty whatbdown on his part, he may be liable to a deducting from his calony to make good the damage or any part thereof, the amount of which shall be fixed by the Head of his Department.

12. The person engaged shall, if so tequired by the Government, furnish such security and in such form as the Government may decide, for the faithful and honest discharge his duties, and if any premium is payable in respect of such security it may be deducted from his salary by the Governmen 13. When the person engaged is not in the Colony the

Crown Agents for the Colonies, when duly authorized by the Government or by the Secretarynof State for the Colonies, shall be competent to exercise any of the powers of the Government under this Agreement.
