On the 7th October, 1925, Colonel, Walker came to see me in connection with the proposal, that he should go to East Africa as Secretary to the Governors conference. He pointed out that if he remained on in the Indian Army he would probably be promoted a Major-General in six years' time and in the meantime would possibly get a salary of about £1800a year which would be very nearly equal to the total amount he would get if he now, retired and drew an Indian pension of \$900 a year and got £1000 a year for the suggested appointment.

Walker that we could not guarantee him permanent employment in the Colonial Service and that we could not go even so far as appointing him as Secretary to the Governors. He actually asked me if I thought that, in the event of the Governors' Conference being a success and his doing well in the capacity of Secretary, he would be considered for a Colonial appointment.

T was quite frank with him and said that it was absolutely impossible to make any promise whatsoever in this connection and that although, if he were ell reported on by the various Rovernors in East Africa with whom he came in additact, it was possible he might be so considere it was at the same time impossible to say what views whatever Secretary of State happened to se here in a few years' time right take; and further I impressed on Colonel Welker how difficult it was to bring outsiders into the Colonial Service unless in very exceptional cases: and that we were everyday face: with the problem of people who, like himself, thought they had a claim on the Gulonial Office and who could not be found permanent employment

I told Colonel Walker that I had included the matter with the Secretary of Steep who was prepared to increase his salary from 1000 to 21200 but that this was asfar as he would go and that no promise of permanent employment could be given.
