TELEGRAM from the Officer Administering the Government of the Somaliland Protectorate to the Secretary of State for the Colonies.

Dated 7th November 1920.

(Received Colonial Office 10.10.20. 7th November, 1920.)

7th November.

I have received indefinite information from Hesse that other East African Dependencies have joined the East African Trade and Information Agency, but that Somaliland is not included. I suggest tentatively that this Protectorate should take part. My information is vague and I should be glad to hear further details. I also suggest for your consideration advisability of this Protectorate being represented at the Conference of East African Governors shortly to be held at Nairobi.
