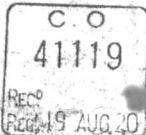

I am directed to acknowledge receipt of your letter No. 38914/1920, dated August 17th, and to enquire whether it was under the authority of the Local Government of East Africa, or by direction of the Colonial Office, that the salaries of officials were paid at the rate of Rs. 15 to the £ up to the 1st April 1920.

As regards the second paragraph of your letter, I am to point out that any information obtained from our friends in East Africa would not have official authority. My Committee were under the impression that such information as is asked for was tabulated at the Colonial Office and would be available to the public.
