I am directed to inform you that the Executive Committee of this Association has approved of a loan of £10,000. to the British West Africa Disabled Officers' Colony on the following conditions:-

- (1). The loan to be in the form of debentures secured on the assets of the Company.
- (2). That two trustees be appointed by the Governor of Kenya to supervise the expenditure of the loan and advise as to repayment.
- (3). That the amount should be repaid in four quarterly instalments.

I am to thank you for the assistance rendered in the matter, and to express my Committee's regrets that beyond this loan of £10,000. they will be unable to give any further assistance to this colony.


