
Dear Mr. Batterbee,

I duly received two numbers of "The Journal"
and the copies of your recent circular on the terms
of service for European officials, all of which I have
read with great interest. I am very much obliged to

the question, my Executive Council have accepted the view
that the new conditions of service are such as would
justify an announcement in "The Post" to the effect
that members of the Home Service might now freely apply
for any vacancies that are announced under the new terms.

will appear in our journal next week.

I will send you in due course a short
memorandum of our views on the question of women's
employment and the necessity for machinery that will
readily enable ~~existing~~ postal workers and other
Civil Servants in the Protectorates to make ~~good~~
