Sir,

With reference to your letter of the 3rd inst. ^{Jan 14/20}
(an answer to which has been delayed owing to my being touring ^{to the Eastern Agents}
in Scotland). I have submitted a statement of expenses in
connection with the purchase of live stock in South Africa for
the B.E.A. Government.

I enclose herewith a ^{copy of the} statement of accounts as also
a copy of the covering letter and further copy of a letter to
a Mr. Abbott in Natal, who I appointed as agent to complete
purchases and to arrange the shipment etc. of the stock to East
Africa.

The sum which I was authorised to expend was £5,000
of which I spent £4,374. 2. 2, including £45.8.0 for my passage
from Cape Town to Plymouth, which latter sum should be allocated
to item, "Passages" in the Agricultural Department Vpte. The
unexpended balance of the £5,000 is therefore £669.5.10.

The stock purchased by me consisted of

- 9 Shorthorn Bulls
- 10 Friesland Do.
- 6 Ayrshire Do.
- 2 Tamworth Pigs
- 1 Jackass
- 5 Merino rams

In addition to which Mr. Abbott was given £5,000 to cover railage, shipping &c. expenses and to purchase as far as possible a further

- 2 Hereford Bulls
- 16 Shorthorn Do (including 6 already shipped by him.)
- 2 Ayrshire Do
- 3 Friesland Do
- 3 Polled Angus Do.

So the approximate number of livestock sent to B.E.A. would be

- 25 Shorthorn Bulls
- 13 Friesland Do
- 8 Ayrshire Do
- 2 Hereford Do
- 3 Polled Angus Do.
- 2 Tamworth Pigs
- 1 Jackass
- 5 Merino Rams

59 head at a cost not to exceed £4,350. 14. 2.

It would be in the interest of the Government of B.E.A. to purchase in England high-class Stud Stock for the Naivasha Stock Farm with the balance of the money, viz., 5. 10.

I am prepared to make the purchases, but might I suggest in view of the high prices ruling at home and to enable me to buy Bulls of extra quality, that £1000 or more if the money can be obtained be sanctioned for this purpose.

The quality of the pure bred stock on the Government Farm at Naivasha has been brought to that high standard that from

a stock-breeder's point of view only the best of sires should be used on the farm; with the present and growing demand the purchase of such should prove an excellent investment for the Government. Last year I made a profit of over £5000 from the Neivasha Farm.

I am prepared, should you wish, to come to the Colonial Office at any time to discuss this matter. 251

Gentlemen,

Before leaving Nairobi on the 18th June last, I was instructed to break my journey home at Durban (provided I could get a berth at a later date from Cape Town to England) and purchase stock for the B.E.A. Government, and a letter of credit was given allowing me to spend up to £5,000.

On my arrival at Durban on the 20th of June I proceeded to the Union Castle Office and got the Agent to telegraph to the Head Office at Cape Town asking for a passage on the "Cap Polonic" which was due to sail three weeks later, the interval being I considered sufficient to make purchases of stock. My request was granted and later when I reached Pretoria I was given a free pass over the railways. This privilege together with many free runs in private motor cars enabled me to keep down expenses.

The "Cap Polonic" was delayed until the 7th August for certain engine repairs but the extra time which I had in the Union did not allow of my purchasing all the animals required as owners in many instances were not disposed to sell except at the forthcoming auction sales, and I had therefore to leave the sum of £3,000 with Mr. R. Abbot of Mooi River Hotel to complete

purchases, his expenditure to be accounted for direct to the Agricultural Department Nairobi.

I enclose copy of correspondence with Mr. Abbot and others for transmittal to Nairobi.

In the accompanying statement of my expenditure I show an outlay of £4374. 2. 2 as against £4391.17.0 drawn under my letter of credit, the difference being £17.14.10 for which I enclose a cheque. I may state that my subsistence allowance did not cover my actual expenses and such are far below what would have had to be paid were the purchases of the stock entrusted to a private agent.

I have submitted receipts for the various items of expenditure as far as it was possible to obtain them.

I have purchased for the B.E.A. Government the following stock:-

From King & Sons, Bedford	8	Short Horn Bulls

I have paid for all these purchases with the exception of the two Bulls from Mr. Thompson which if they pass the tuberculin test will you please pay Mr. Drysdale his Agent the sum of £115.10.0

I am handing you over the sum of £3000, to cover (a) the approximate cost of six short horn Bulls which you have already sent to British East Africa (b) the freight of the above 22 Bulls, 2 Pigs and 5 Rams approximately £440, and for the payment of further purchases of stock which you have kindly undertaken to obtain namely

2 Hereford Bulls
10 Short Horn Bulls
2 Ayrshire Bulls
3 Friesland Bulls
4 Black Polls.

For one of the Friesland Bulls you can pay up to £300. The others I gather you can obtain at an approximate price of £60 each delivered Mombasa. I have arranged with the Union Castle Company, Durban for the shipment of all the stock by the "Servic Castle" sailing from Durban about the 23rd of August but it might be well for you to get into touch with the Company in case of any delays in the sailing of the Steamer, further I shall be glad if you will arrange for a white practical man to accompany and take charge of the stock to Mombasa.

A Cablegram should be sent to "Agriculture" Nairobi when the stock is shipped stating the number of animals and the approximate date of arrival of the Steamer at Mombasa.

In view of the shortage of pasture in the Bedford District I shall be glad if you can have stock purchased by me there taken to Myoi River until shipped in fact it would be well to have all purchases concentrated on your farm immediately after purchase. Payment will be made you for any expenses incurred on food stuffs as also railage etc. of the animals.

I have asked Messrs King & Son as also Mr. Van Niekerk each of them to send a boy in charge of the stock as far as Bloemfontein so as to insure them being watered and fed there. If there are any other points on which you want information please communicate with me to the Mount Nelson Hotel, Cape Town, before the 6th of August.

S.S. If you can purchase a young Berkshire Boar and also a Long Black about six months old I shall be glad if you would do so and forward them with the other stock.

I have instructed those people from whom I have purchased stock to send you the tuberculin certificates as also the Pedigree of the stock and also to communicate with you direct should they wish for any particulars with regard to the forwarding etc. of the animals.

Please render a full statement of expenditure to the Asst. Dir. of Agriculture, Nairobi.
