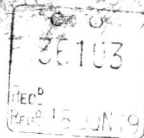

I have the honour to submit this my application for Colonial Allowance for the period stated in the enclosed duty certificate. I also enclose the reply I received from the Commanding Officer South Africa on applying for that allowance there. You will therefore see my position in this matter and I hope be able to inform me of the proper procedure. The amount in question is ten pounds six shillings (£10-6-0) fifty two days at four shillings per day this is the present rate in South Africa. Since the 1<sup>st</sup> March 1919 on leaving East Africa I have been on Imperial rates of pay (£10/6 per day) and have drawn no allowances whatever.
